Rooted in centuries-old techniques passed down through oral traditions, this miniaturized art form demands dedication, patience, and a mastery of brushwork, highlighting the artisans' expertise and the craft's enduring cultural significance.

Discarded paper, cloth, straw of rice plant, Paper-Machie Base, Natural Dyes and Pigments, Golden & silver foil, Lacquer or Varnish.

METHOD OF PRODUCTION

Traditional Paper Machie in Kashmir is a meticulously crafted art form carried out through three distinct stages of production, each handled by skilled artisans. Initially shaped by the Saktasazi community into lightweight structures, these objects undergo successive layers of traditional primer to achieve smoothness. The naqash then meticulously paints intricate designs, incorporating gold and silver detailing. Finally, the pieces are polished with jade stone for a glossy finish and coated with local varnishes like copal or industrial lacquer.
